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Introduction - Searching for The McManus Family History

The information that follows, along with copies of documents, and photos of houses in which our ancestors lived are intended to give you some insight into our family history. The copies of documents include passenger lists, death certificates, voter registration records, censuses, and newspaper articles. After reading this study, it is my hope that you will be motivated to begin your own research into our history, research that will expand our knowledge of our ancestors.

Who were these immigrants? Where did they come from? What did they do once they arrived in the United States. Where did they live? Where are they buried? These questions, and many more, guided the research that follows.

By consulting the appropriate documents, some of these questions were easily answered. The sources for most of those documents were obtained through ancestry.com, FamilySearch.com, and the Maryland State Archives. Other questions need more research because the needed documents were either not found or were unavailable at the time of the research. Some questions will always remain unanswered because there are no records which would answer the questions and the eye witness has passed.

By turning the page you will learn about our great grandparents and their children, where they worked, where they lived, and eventually, where they died. You will learn for the first time, the names of our great-great grandparents and our great-great grandparents.

"McManus Family History"

"The ancient origin of the name McManus was found in the irishsurnames.com archives. The name McManus is often stated to be Norse in origin but in fact it is as thoroughly Irish as any ancient Gaelic name. McManus is McMaghnuis in modern Irish, meaning 'son of Magnus'. In two separate cases it descended from individual persons called Maghnus. The first is descended from Maghnus who died in 1181, son of Turlough O'Connor, King of Ireland, and who was seated in the parish of Kilronan in Roscommon. The other, a distinguished Fermanagh family, lived on the shores of Lough Erne. The present day bearers of the name are found in greater numbers in their original habitat than elsewhere. The name holds second place in the list of most numerous names in Fermanagh, but does not so appear in any other County. It is however, in some parts of Ulster, disguised under the English form Moyne. The McManus family crest (or coat of arms) came into existence many centuries ago. The process of creating these coats of arms began as early as the eleventh century although a form of Proto-Heraldry may have existed in some countries prior to this, including Ireland. The new more formalized art of Heraldry made it possible for families and even individual family members to have their very own crest. coat of arms, including McManus descendants."

"McManus"

"This distinguished Irish surname is an Anglicized form of the old Gaelic Mac Maghnuis or Mac

Manus. The Gaelic prefix "mac" meaning "son of", plus the personal name Manus, ultimately from

the Latin "magnus" meaning "great", and popular with the Normans who had adopted it in honour

of the Emperor Charlemange (742 - 814); Latin name Carolus Magnus i.e. Charles the Great. Magnus

was also a popular Scandinavian personal name, and Magnus the Good, King of Norway, (deceased

1047), was named after the Emperor Charlemange. It was the Norsemen who introduced this

personal name to Ireland where it later took the form Manus. Two main septs of M(a)cManus exist

in Ireland. The first is descended from one Maghnus (deceased 1181), son of Turlough O' Connor,

High King of Ireland, (1119 - 1156). They belonged to Kilronan in the Connacht county of

Roscommon. The second family, a branch of the Maguires, descend from Magnus, son of Donn

Maguire, Chief of Fermanagh, who died in 1302. This family lived on the shores of Lough Erne,

COunty Fermanagh, and Belle Isle in that lake was formerly called Ballymacmanus in their honour.

The first recorded spelling of the family name is shown to be that of Hugh Mcmanus, (marriage to

Mary Gawin), which was dated 1662, Derry Cathedral, Templemore, Derry, during the reign of King

Charles 11, of England, 1660 - 1685. Surnames became necessary when governments introduced

personal taxation. In England this was known as Poll Tax. Throughout the centuries, surnames in


every country have continued to "develop" often leading to astonishing variants of the original

spelling."

The McManus Family - The Beginning

The 14th of May 1860

On Monday, the 14th of May 1860, Thomas McManus and Jane McCutcheon were married in Newtownards, Ireland. Although that date is not the beginning of the McManus family history in Ireland, it is where this genealogical search begins. From that date, our family history stretches from Ireland to Scotland to the United States.

There may be sources that document Thomas' and Jane's history in Ireland, as well as the history of their parents. The documents and comments that follow, however, relate only to those events began in Ireland with their marriage and ending in their lives in the United States.

From Ireland to Scotland to the United States

When the family immigrated to Scotland from Ireland they came with their first born child, Eliza Jane. In Scotland, Jane gave birth to three other children, Andrew, Mary Ann, and Thomas. Later in the United States the number of children in the family would more than double to 9. Of note is an item in the 1900 Census: "Mother of how many children." The response was 10. The next item: "Number of these children living". The response was 8. Records of the date of birth, date of death, and name of the 10th child were not found. One child was born in Ireland, three were born in Scotland, and 5 were born in Maryland.

In 1872, five members of our family immigrated to the United States on the S S Columbia from a port in Glasgow, Scotland. The members of the family on board were Thomas (father), Jane, Andrew, Mary Ann, and Thomas (son). A partial passenger list of the S S Columbia is included in this research; their names are on that list. The 1910 Census asked for "Year immigrated to the United States". The response was "1871". That response was for Thomas (father), Jane, Eliza, and Thomas (son). Andrew was not listed but his name was on the passenger list.

At age 10, Eliza Jane's name appears on another passenger list (included) on the S. S. India; she is number 5 near the bottom of the list. That ship also sailed from Glasgow but in 1871, a year before her parents and siblings had immigrated. Both ships were bound for and landed in New York. Eventually, all six members of the family settled in the small western town of Barton, Maryland.

There were five children born to Thomas and Jane McManus in Maryland, David, William, George (our grandfather), John, and Hugh. In 1896 many of the records of the 1890 Census were badly damaged as a result of a fire. In 1921, a second fire consumed many of the remaining records; those records that did survive were waterlogged and neglected. Those remaining records were destroyed by government administrators years later. Unfortunately, records from the 1890 Census for the McManus family were not found. The name Thomas McManus does not appear in the 1900 Census and the 1910 Census identified Jane as widow.

Maryland State Map


The McManus Family, 8 in all, immigrated from Glasgow, Scotland to New York and then to Maryland in 1872.






Scotland




Maryland State Map

Members of The McManus Family First Generation in The United States

Thomas McManus (father) was born in 1939 in Ireland. Early records of his life with his family in Ireland may be available with a subscription to <u>ancestry.com</u>. Thomas, his wife and three children, appear on the 1871 Census of Scotland (included). His wife Jane and their first child, Eliza Jane, were born in Ireland. Sometime after his marriage in 1860, he and his family moved to Scotland. Andrew, Mary Ann, and Thomas were born in Scotland. The 1971 Census in Scotland and the 1880 Census in the United States list his occupation as "miner". His name does not appear on any other Census in the United States. He immigrated to the Unites States in 1872 aboard the S S Columbia. The family settled in Barton, Maryland. Records of his date of death and place of burial were not found. **Thomas McManus is our great grandfather**

Jane (McCutcheon) McManus, like her husband, was born in 1839 in Ireland. Records of her life there may be available through ancestry.com. Jane and Thomas were married on 14 May 1860 in Newtownards, Ireland. Their first child, Eliza Jane, was born in Ireland. The 1871 National Records of Scotland listed her occupation a 'muslin sewer' (see definitions); in all of the censuses in the United States after that point her occupation was 'keeping house'. The 1910 United States Census indicated that Jane was a widow and was living with 4 of her children, Eliza Jane (39), Thomas (23), our Grandfather George (20), and Hugh (19). Jane's parents were Andrew McCutcheon and Ellen (Minnis) McCutcheon; they were our Great-Great Grandparents. She died in 1915 in Barton, Maryland at the age of 72. Her place of burial was not found. Jane McCutcheon is our great grandmother

Eliza Jane McManus was the eldest child of Thomas and Jane McManus. She arrived in the United States in 1871 on the S S India at the age of 10 (see passenger list). After the death of her mother, Jane, Eliza Jane was listed as "head" of the household in subsequent censuses. The 1930 Census indicated that she owned her house; the house in 1930 was valued at \$1000. Records from the Tax and Voter Registration in Allegany County, Maryland in 1928 list her name. That record is included here. She registered as "Rep"[ublican"]. She died in Barton, Maryland on 8 March 1934. Arrangements for her funeral were by Boal Funeral Home in Barton. The funeral home was contacted but could not provide any additional information. Her place of burial was not found.

Andrew McManus(MacMannis) was born in Scotland on August 20, 1864. He came to the United States with his father (Thomas), mother (Jane), his sister (Mary Ann), and his younger brother (Thomas) in 1872 onboard the S S Columbia. The ship landed in New York City. The 1880

US Census lists his occupation as "miner"; he was 16 years old. His death certificate (included) also describes his occupation as "coal operator" and he worked in a "coal washery" (see definitions). His name appears on the 1904 Tax and Voter Records of Allegany County, Maryland and he registered as "Dem" [ocrat]. The house in which he lived according to tax records was built in 1925 and was valued at \$4000 on the 1930 Census. A photograph of that house on Broadway Avenue is included. A photograph of the previous structure on that location in which he lived was not found. Andrew died on November 3, 1933 at Miners' Hospital in Frostburg. Andrew's address in Frostburg was 66 Broadway Avenue. Number 33 on Broadway is the Frostburg Presbyterian Church. After doing a search of the church records, a spokesperson, Denise Booth, for the church indicated that there was no record of his marriage to Mary J. nor of the baptism of his only child, Henry B. Andrew'a name can be found on the death certificate (included) of his mother, Jane McManus. Andrew's name on that certificate was "McMannis", on the 1930 Census it was "MacMannis", and on his death certificate it was also "MacMannis". Andrew McManus (MacMannis) is buried in Frostburg Memorial Park, Frostburg, Maryland.

On the 19th of September 1865 **Mary Ann McManus** was born in Dalry, Scotland; she was baptized on the 17th of October 1866. She arrived in the United States with her parents and two of her siblings, Andrew and Thomas in 1872 on the S S Columbia. She married John Jefferson McIntyre. Documents found in the 1932 Tax and Voter Registration records in Allegany County, Maryland for Mary Ann McIntyre indicated that her name was being removed from the voter rolls. Prior to that date she had registered as a "Rep"[ublican]. Two photographs of different houses in which she lived are included. One house was located at 628 Fairview Avenue, Cumberland, Maryland, the other house was at 309 Main Street North, Keyser, West Virginia. Mary Ann (McManus) McIntyre died on the 20th of December 1951 in Keyser, WV. According to her obituary, Mary Ann is buried in Queens Point Cemetery in Keyser, West Virginia. No photograph of her tombstone in Queens Point Cemetery on Findagrave.com was found.

In 1872 at the age of 1, **Thomas McManus** (son) and his family immigrated from a port in Glasgow, Scotland to the United States. He was the last member of the family born either in Ireland or in Scotland. His soon to be born siblings, there were 5 of them, were born in Barton, Maryland. Thomas worked in the mines. According to the 1910 United States Census he was living with his mother, Jane McManus, and his sister, Eliza, and his brothers William, George, and Hugh. Also living in the house was a son (Howard McIntyre) who was born to his sister, Mary Ann (McManus) McIntyre. Prior to the publication of the 1920 United States Census, Thomas married Euphemia (Moore) Ryan. Euphemia and her first husband had 5 children, John, Marie, Elizabeth, Leona, and Leo. Thomas died on March 27, 1948 and is buried in Union Dale Cemetery in Pittsburgh, PA. A photograph of his tombstone can be found on findagrave.com bathroom.

On September 12, 1918 at the age of 45, **David McManus** registered for the draft. At that time he was living in Chicago; he listed his occupation as "mason". The 1910 United States Census lists his occupation as "plumber". David was born in Barton, Maryland on the 14th of September 1873 and died in Chicago, Illinois at the age of 82 on March 20, 1950. There is no photograph of his tombstone on findagrave.com and his place of burial is uncertain.

William McManus was born on Wednesday, May 30, 1877 in Barton, Maryland. In the three censuses of 1900, 1910, and 1920 his occupation was "miner". His name does not appear of any census after 1920. Records from the Tax and Voter Registration of 1897 indicated that William was living in Barton on Legislative Road. He listed his age as 22. No party affiliation was indicated. William died at the age of 46 in 1923. No information was found of his place of death nor place of burial.

George McManus was born on Tuesday, the 4th of March 1879, in Barton, Maryland. Beginning with 1900 Census and continuing until he retired, his occupation was working in the mining industry as a miner, a loader, or as a laborer. The 1930 United States Census indicates that the family consisting of George, Bertha (Cutter), his wife, and their three children, Ida, George, and Frank were living on Legislative Road in Barton. Sometime after the 1930 Census, the family moved to a house just outside of the town of Lonaconing, Maryland in an area that was named Rockville. The 1940 United States Census indicated that the family now consisted of George (father), Bertha, George (son), and Frank. Ida McManus had married William Anderson Robertson prior to that Census and was no longer living with the family.

The house was divided for two families and was a rental. According to the 1940 Census the rent was \$7.00 per month. There was no central heating in the house. A cast iron coal stove in the kitchen provided heat for the house and a surface for cooking. The house did not have an indoor bathroom. Near the back of the property was a two seat outhouse. Bathing involved putting tap water into a large galvanized tub near the stove and pouring hot water from a heated kettle from the stove into the tub to create warm water. There was a small icebox in the kitchen and periodically ice would be delivered to replenish the ice that had melted. The McManus family had a wringer clothes washing machine that was located on a screened porch at the back of the house. Clothes were hung on a clothes line in the backyard to dry.

The house had a bedroom on the first floor just off the kitchen. There were two rooms beyond the kitchen. The living room on the right had a small space heater, the 'good furniture' and a piano. The room on the left of the living room was where Bertha would set up her frames for making hooked rugs. In the back of the room was a large cabinet where she stored her best pieces of tableware. At the end of that room on the right was a door that opened to a staircase that led to an attic. The attic was divided into two and was used as second and third bedrooms. Although the McManus house was demolished in (about) 2014, several similar houses for comparison are still inhabited near where that house stood. George and Bertha McManus are buried in Oak Hill

Cemetery in Lonaconing, Maryland. A photograph of their tombstone can be found on Findagrave.com.

John McManus' name appears on the United States Census for 1880. His age was listed as 3 months. No other records were found for John McManus.

Hugh McManus was the last child born to Thomas and Jane McManus; he was born in Barton, Maryland. Records from the Tax and Voter Registration of 1902 for Allegany County, Maryland indicate that Hugh was registered as "Rep"[ublican]. Like his father and his brothers, Hugh worked in the coal industry. He worked as a "laborer" according to the United States Census of 1920, however, in the 1930 Census Hugh's occupation was "hardware salesman". After four years at the Sylvan Retreat in Cumberland, Maryland, Hugh McManus died at the age of 64. His death certificate indicates that he also taught the violin. His obituary indicates that he was buried in the Laurel Hill Cemetery in Moscow, Maryland. No photograph of his tombstone on Findagrave.com was found.

*NB: Although the street name remains today, some house numbers in the area have changed. This is also true for the house numbers in Barton, Maryland, where our immigrant ancestors first settled. When that change occurred was not determined. The locations of the houses in Barton were not found.

The houses that still remain on Rockville Street that were 17 and 18, respectively, are now numbered 16008 and 16012. George and Bertha's house was demolished in (about) 2014 and the lot as of this writing is vacant. The location of their house can be found by using 16012 Rockville Street, Lonaconing, Maryland 21539 in a search engine similar to MapQuest.

Second, almost none of the research relied on documents in Ireland. Those documents do exist and can be reviewed although that will take a great deal of effort on your part. The starting point would be our history in Ireland; the history of our great grandparents, Thomas and Jane (McCutcheon) McManus. It would also include the history of their parents.





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

Typically, people with this job support miners who are more specialized. They may work as a part of a team or on their own. They may be supervised or take direction from the more specialized miners or other senior workers on the job site.

Mine labourers need to be flexible and adapt to different ways of doing things. They must also be able to work under pressure while understanding and following safety regulations.

People in this job need mechanical skills. They must also be able to read and write, communicate with co-workers, have basic analytical skills as well as follow instructions.

- Assist other mine workers to maintain and construct underground installations
- Clean underground rooms, roadways, working areas and mining equipment
- Transport and organize materials/supplies
- Clear away spills of ore or coal"

Coal Washery

"Coal Washing

Coal washing is a process that is undertaken in a coal washery or coal preparation plant (CPP) where coal is refined or cleaned of impurities. Coal washing involves using water, mechanical techniques and relies on gravity and the difference of density between coal and it's impurities which are usually more densely packed due to the fact that they are inorganic.

Coal is a type of sedimentary rock that is formed by buried vegetation that is transformed by pressure and heat over long periods of time. Coal will eventually turn into diamond formations with enough time, pressure and heat. Impurities include slate and other non-organic rocks etc.. Washing coal increases its efficiency and quality, therefore increasing its price. It can also help to reduce emissions from burning."

Muslin Sewer

In the end of last century the embroidering of muslin was adopted as a fashionable recreation by ladies in this country. The sewed muslin was a cheap and beautiful substitute for lace, and there was practically no limit to the variety of designs. At first the patterns generally were crude and inartistic; but as taste improved the beauty of the stitching was enhanced by the elegance of the designs. In course of time the embroidering of muslin became a favourite occupation for spare hours with all classes. In the early years of this century it was made a branch of manufacture by some enterprising men in Glasgow, and it is in that connection that it claims notice here. The pioneers of the trade began operations at a time when many women who had depended on the spinning wheel for a living were thrown out of work by the introduction of spinning machinery. There was, consequently, an abundance of willing hands ready to accept the new employment. The manufacturers had to proceed with caution, however, and make certain of a market before they embarked to any great extent in the venture; and it was, therefore, some years before the trade assumed much importance. Up till 1825 only two or three firms were engaged in it, but these gave employment to many hands. The work was given out to the women to be executed in their own homes. The lasses of Ayrshire showed great aptitude for embroidering, and soon made a name for the excellence of their work—indeed, for a long time the embroidered muslins were sold in the home and foreign markets as "Ayrshire needle-work." In various parts of the county schools for teaching muslin-sewing were established. Three months were considered a fair period for training a girl; and when that term expired the pupil usually began to receive payment for her work, remaining in the school, however, for some time until she attained a certain degree of proficiency. When she began to receive payment for her work, a charge of 2d. or 3d. a-week was made for school-rent, or, as it was called, "stoolroom."
